



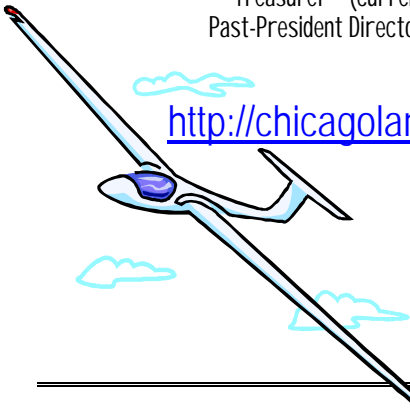

A multimedia presentation of vintage photography and video footage showing how Chicago has been a center of soaring and glider activities, research and development stretching back to the dawn of flight. Presented by Simine Short who is an aviation historian and the Chair of the National Soaring Museum's "Landmark Program." She has written more than 100 papers on the history of motor-less flight, published in the United States and Europe. She is a collector of Glider related postage stamps. In her professional career, Simine is currently employed as an instrumental analytical chemist at the Materials Science Division/Intense Pulsed Neutron Source, Argonne National Laboratory, Argonne, Illinois.

CLGC Spring Soaring and Safety Seminar - This is going to be an exciting all day event (March 19th) which the CLGC is helping to underwrite. See details below.

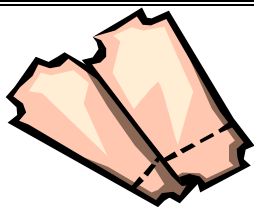

Soaring Safety Foundation Chicago Flight Instructor Refresher Clinic

January 8-9, 2005
Lombard, IL

The Soaring Safety Foundation (SSF), the training and safety arm of the SSA is chartered to improve the safety environment for all U.S. soaring pilots. To accomplish this task, the SSF gathers accident statistics, monitors soaring activity, publishes articles and videos on safe soaring practices, and hold safety and training seminars.

One of the major activities is the Flight Instructor Refresher Clinic (FIRC) program. This FAA approved course provides CFGI the opportunity to renew their flight instructor certificate in a highly interactive training environment. The mandatory 16 hours of classroom instruction cover all aspects of soaring and teaching in sailplanes. The course instructors are well known in the U.S. soaring community and bring a wealth of experience to the classroom.

The course contents are continually reviewed and revisions are made often to ensure that the present the most current thinking on how to teach safe soaring practices. The course is also structured to encourage an interaction between the instructors and participants. This isn't a boring 16 hour lecture, but an opportunity to discuss the issues and challenges that make instructing in gliders difficult. This format has proven to be very productive for all attendees.

The main purpose for the clinic is to promote soaring safety. A review of the U.S. soaring accidents shows that 70% of the accidents occur in the approach and landing phase of flight. This fact, and potential solutions, are woven into almost every talk, making this a coherent theme that runs through the course. If you are interested in reducing these accidents, then this clinic is a must attend for you.

While the clinic allows glider flight instructors to renew their certificates, you do not need to be a flight instructor to attend. You just need a strong interest in learning more about soaring and how you can become a safer pilot. The clinic will begin at 8:30 am on Saturday January 8 at the Embassy Suites hotel in Lombard. There is a \$125.00 charge for this clinic and refreshments are included during the morning and afternoon breaks. Reservations are taken on a first-come basis and seating is limited to 30, so make your reservation soon.
