

# ChicagoLand Glider Council Youth Scholarships

Each year the CLGC presents one or more youth Scholarships. We all know that the youth is the future of soaring and we must foster their efforts as often as we can. This scholarship is your CLGC dues in action in a direct and positive way.

The requirements to apply for the scholarship are;

- Be a member in good standing of the ChicagoLand Glider Council,
- ➤ Be between the ages of 14 and 21 (inclusive as of March 19th, 2005).
- Provide proof of a private glider pilot rating (or higher) or solo log book endorsement,
- Obtain a written recommendation from a Certified Flight Instructor Glider (CFIG) who is familiar with the applicant's qualifications and,
- Write an original typed essay of 500-1000 words on "What Soaring Means to Me....".

### 2005 SSA Convention Report

By John DeRosa – The SSA convention was held in Ontario California and was well worth the trip. Before the first day of the convention I spend the day at the Wings of Fame Museum and the Yank's Museum in nearby Chino. What a fantastic sight to see all that historic aviation hardware.

The convention hall had many, many gliders, motor gliders and light sport aircraft on display along with 30 vendors. There was a Silent



sailplane with a pair of jet engines for thrust. As I can attest, it wasn't so "silent" anymore.

For the historic glider buffs there was a Bowlus Baby Albatross on display that was nearly 100% rebuilt and shines like a diamond. I was told during the Vintage

Sailplane Association breakfast that it took 2 years to complete the restoration.

During the general membership meeting several local pilots were recognized. Duane Eisenbeiss was applauded for his work resurrecting the World Distance Award program. Judy Rupreck was given an award for her "Badge Lady" efforts. Also, Geoff Weck was recognized for awarding the most soaring badges in Region 7. Finally Gunter Voltz, Mgr. of Thermal Sniffer Soaring at Hartford, WI, was inducted into the SOARING HALL OF FAME. Congratulations to everyone.

What I find most informative are the many speeches that I attended. The speech about the Perlan project to soar to 100K feet - with Einar Enevoldson (pilot), Dr Elizabeth Austin (project meteorologist) and the renowned Steve Fossett - was one of the many highlights. Another key speech for me was intended for beginner competition pilots entitled "Somebody Has to Lose, and I'm Ready".

The finale of any SSA convention is the Annual Awards Banquet. The keynote speaker was Mike Melville, the pilot of the first Space Ship One flight. Mike gave a riveting and fascinating technical talk on his flight complete with many pictures and videos.


